**I. Call to order:**

Jacqueline Jolosky asked the Board what they could do in regards to the “chicken farms” in North Barrington. There was discussion stating that unincorporated Cuba Township needs to follow the guidelines of Lake County and that the Township has no oversight in regulation. The Township will still closely monitor and assist in any way possible to make sure they are following the approved permits.

Those projects have begun and should be paved around June 25<sup>th</sup>. Another street which went to bid is Lake Shore Dr. in the Fairhaven subdivision which will begin later in the season. There are other additional road paving projects that will be done in house. Podgorski also reported that the Tub Grinder, which is the machine used to make mulch, is still not working causing the mulch program to be halted for now.
